

David Aide aka Rooster Davis is an Edmonton based freelance piano and Hammond organ player. He has seriously studied the Hammond organ, having worked in this regard with highly acclaimed musicians including Hawksley Workman, country star Adam Gregory, Adam Cohen, Americana/roots artists Jack Marks, James Murdoch, The Wheatpool, and soul/folk songstress Ann Vriend.

Dave Babcock

A Distinguished Alumni Award recipient from MacEwan University, Edmonton artist Dave Babcock leads a rich musical life with an underlying confidence only a man of his abilities and experience can possess. Over the past four decades he's earned his reputation as one of Canada's finest R&B saxophonists. A long time member of Canada's blues community, Dave will be inducted into the Edmonton Blues Hall of Fame on Oct. 6th.

The evening will include a special conversation about the history of the blues in Edmonton from the sixties to present day by media person and promoter Peter North and Holger Petersen of Stony Plain Records, CBC, and CKUA.

Sherryl Sewepagaham, a dynamic Cree-Dene artist from Little Red River Cree Nation, Northern Alberta, blends her heritage with artistry, composition, and education. She is a PhD scholar at UBC, composer, song keeper, and performance artist. Her compositions enrich Cree narratives celebrated in national choir commissions and international performances with the acclaimed trio, Asani.

Debbie Houle is Cree and Dene from the Elizabeth Metis Settlement and has been working as an artist and community builder in Edmonton's Indigenous community for over 30 years. Debbie was one of five founding members of the Indigenous women's trio, Asani. They retired in 2019 and in 2020 she joined four Cree women, Sherryl Sewepagaham, Donita Large and Cindy Paul, to form Nipisiy. She also performs regularly with AV & The Inner City. She recently embarked on her own journey of song exploration and will be accompanied by Richard Monkman on bass and Mira Campbell on violin as she performs a few of her original songs along with some favorite covers.





<u>Terry McDade</u>

with a singular style, is taking the Concert Harp to a new and vibrant place. Terry, along with The McDades, has performed with the ESO, many Royal Visits & for various Lieutenant Governors of Alberta & is looking forward to playing for you! He has performed throughout Canada, the U.S & in China and has recorded four critically acclaimed CDs to date; Harpe Danse, Midwinter, Noel and 2011's Winter Rose. Jeremiah McDade is an award winning multi-instrumentalist, producer, arranger & composer. Darren Jordan

Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee Medal recipient Darren Jordan has cemented his roots in Edmonton through his commitment to uplifting artists. A highly decorated arts practitioner Jordan has been recognized with a 2011 Fil Fraser Award, a 2016 Afro Canadian Heroes Award, and a 2023 Edmonton Artists Trust Fund Award. This in addition to sitting on the board of directors for the Francis Winspear Center for Music have made Jordan an influencer to say the least.

Although best known for being the curator of Edmonton's annual Black History Month event 5 Artists 1 Love, Jordan was once a part of two legendary breaking crews - Untouchable Crew and later Supreme Rockers. As one of the city's premier pop lockers, Jordan was a mainstay on the battle scene competing all across the province.



Touch (Randy Mark)



Born on Treaty 6 Territory, in Edmonton, Alberta, Hip Hop artist, Touch, creates some of the grimiest beats, and chisels together some of the sharpest sentences in Canada's vastly competitive Hip Hop Scene. Over the course of his impressive career, Touch has opened for the likes of RUN DMC, Wu-Tang Clan, and Gang Starr, received Award Nominations, charted on campus radio Hip Hop charts in Canada and the US and built a following in the US, France, Belarus, China, Japan, and all over Canada.

Touch has just completed his newest self produced project A.R.T. (Ancient Rhyme Technique). After studying filmmaking, photography, and studio engineering over the past 5 years, Touch was able to combine all aspects of his creativity into one coherent project which will be released winter 2024.

Dirt Gritie

Bert (Dirt Gritie) Richards is an Edmonton, Alberta born artist and Entrepreneur. As a hip-hop artist and spoken word poet he co-founded Music for Mavericks Ent and the Breath in Poetry Collective but is best known as a member of Edmonton's 3 time WCMA nominated Hip-Hop Group Politic Live. Currently he is the Creative Director of Joyful Noise Inc a company that facilitates Afrocentric Family Entertainment.





KazMega (Jermaine Curtis)

KazMega is a Hip Hop practitioner and direct descendant of some of Edmonton Hip Hop's original pioneers. For KazMega, Hip Hop has never just been a genre of music, or any form of commodifiable asset. Instead it has been a way of life.

Kaz has also played a major role in having Edmonton's Hip Hop scene published academically and continues to push for his city to not only become recognized for its contributions to Kulture of Hip Hop globally, but to become a global leader as a contributor. Be on the lookout for KazMega's docu-album Most Edmonton Music Ever (M.E.M.E.) this upcoming February.

Electro-Acoustic & Experimental Hosted by Dr. Shawn Pinchbeck

Dr. Shawn Pinchbeck is an award winning Edmonton based electroacoustic music composer, audio engineer, performer, curator and educator. His artworks explore all things that sound, often in conjunction with other elements such as: video, computer interaction, multi-speaker environments, sensors and electronics, interdisciplinary performance and gallery installations.

Dr. Shawn Pinchbeck has eight albums of electro acoustic, film and ambient music. His music and sound design has been used in numerous films and contemporary dance performances. Pinchbeck has a PhD degree in electro-acoustic music composition from the University of Birmingham, UK. He is a founding member of the Boreal Electroacoustic Music Society.

"Ööõhk" in Estonian, or "Night Air" in English, was created at the BEAMS residency in Viljandi, Estonia in May this year. The piece was inspired by the neighbourhood where I was staying. Every night a nightingale would start singing around 12:30am, as I drifted off to sleep. Around 3 am, the birds' dawn chorus would start, often waking me. This piece explores this dream-time between, as I'm drifting away to sleep with the night sounds." www.shawnpinchbeck.bandcamp.com

<u>K Burwash</u>

Raised in rural Saskatchewan, Kris Burwash had a much different relationship to music and sound. The quiet of prairie nights, the clamour of farm machinery, the blasting of 80s metal tapes cruising down back roads. In 2001, he opened Listen Records in Edmonton, a hub of experimental music in Western Canada. In 2007 he started vinyl-only label Uzu Audio. In 2016 he dove into the modular synth world, making hazy ambient music that recalls dreams of memories from another life, hypnotic meditations. He has since released 3 full length albums and a double cassette audio sketchbook
